## September: A Very Special Month

Before I dive into this month's diatribe, I'd like to give a shout out to Dan Flanigan, for the hosting of Corvettes West summer social at his and Elaine's Redlands home, this past month. Other than the many polished fiberglass legends gleaming in the California sun, and the usual splendid hospitality bestowed by both Dan and Elaine, Dan had arraigned for some surprising entertainment this year. Most notably a Tom Jones, Dean Martin and Elvis Presley impersonator. This year's event was a classic example of a "Third Space", which I have written about in past articles. For those of you who weren't able to make this year's summer event, you missed a great time.

Now to the business at hand, in case you weren't aware and because I'm sure you all have inquiring minds, September is special because it bridges summer and autumn, marking the autumn equinox around September 22. Its name means "seven" in Latin from the old Roman calendar. It brings back-to-school routines as millions of students return to classrooms worldwide, harvest celebrations like Oktoberfest, and features the sapphire birthstone, symbolizing wisdom, loyalty, and truth.

Historically September has been the backdrop for many major global turning points, ranging from the start of catastrophic conflicts to defining moments in American and world governance. For instance:

## World Wars and Conflicts:

- September 1, 1939: Germany invaded Poland. This act started World War II in Europe.

- September 2, 1945: Japan formally signed surrender documents aboard the USS Missouri. This ended World War II, celebrated as V-J Day.

- September 3, 1783: The Treaty of Paris was signed. It officially ended the American Revolutionary War.

## Modern History and Tragedies:

- September 11, 2001: Terrorists hijacked four commercial airliners in the worst attack on U.S. soil. This led to the creation of the Department of Homeland Security and shaped modern global security.

- September 17, 1862: The Battle of Antietam took place during the American Civil War. It remains the single bloodiest day in American military history.

## Foundations and Governance:

- September 16, 1810: Miguel Hidalgo Costilla issued the Grito de Dolores, sparking the Mexican War of Independence from Spain.

- September 17, 1787: Delegates to the Constitutional Convention signed the United States Constitution in Philadelphia.

Other than the brief historical events mentioned above, there is an event which is near and dear to Corvette owner's heart, as September 2nd 1994, marks the anniversary of the National Corvette Museum, which hosts major milestone celebrations and hall of "Fame Inductions" during the month. This year the inductions occur on Saturday, September 5, during the museum's 32nd Anniversary Celebration. There will be four inductees this year: Kirk Bennion - Visionary exterior design manager, Harlan Charles - Longtime Corvette product manager, John Middlebrook - Former senior General Motors executive recognized for his significant contributions and support of Corvette racing, and last but not least, James Scheffer - The late automotive journalist and author renowned for chronicling the development and history of the Corvette.

Keeping in tune with September's birthdays, the Chevrolet Corvette was officially released to the automotive press for testing on September 29, 1953. Yes, George that means September is the historic birth month for our beloved Corvette.

Lastly, Since this is baseball season, there is one other notable fact that I'd like to mention, the St. Louis Cardinals baseball team's president, Mark Lamping, presented team member Mark McGwire with a red 1962 Corvette, after McGwire hit his 62nd home-run of the season. This occurred on September 8th, 1998 immediately after he hit his record-breaking home run of the season, at Busch Stadium.

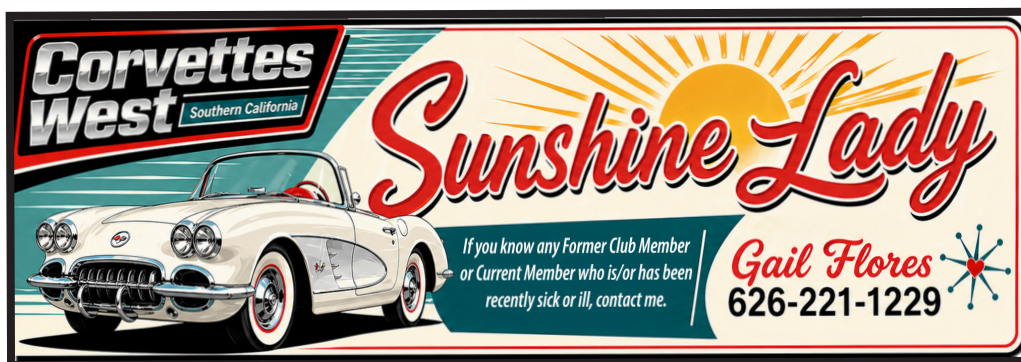

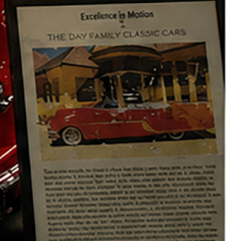

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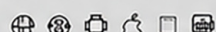
