The Blood Bank (LifeStream) is still in the business of supplying the 80 hospitals in the southern California area. Only now they lack the staff who would deliver the blood to the 80 hospitals.

I donated on a Friday and was surprised to find out that on Friday when you donate, you get a sandwich from Jimmy Johns, to consume in the rest area after you donate.
