So, to our current situation and that being regarding Hummingbirds. Several years ago our youngest daughter bought us a Hummingbird feeder. We hung it out on the eve of our Cabana and noticed so many

Hummingbirds trying to feed so we bought two more feeders and then more birds kept showing up. So currently we have 7 feeders and keep seeing more birds.

Well several days ago while sitting in the dining area I heard a loud noise against one of the glass sliding doors so I went outside to see what it was and saw a small Hummingbird laying on the tile floor and not moving. It was the very aggressive bird that was not letting any of the other birds eat so we called him "The Intimidator". Later we found out he was a "Rufous Bird" which is a very aggressive hummingbird but with a beautiful red chest.

So, I picked him up and put him in a shoe box with a small towel in the bottom and left the top open and put it on top of one of our Tiki's which is high off the tile floor in our patio. I was hoping that maybe he was just dazed and would fly off which it didn't. So that night I put some sugar water in the box and put the box in the Casita where is was warm and left the door open so it could fly off.

In the morning I checked the box and the little guy was still in there so he didn't fly away as I had hoped. Thinking he needed to be outside and with the sun out I was hoping that the sun would get him warm and he would possibly fly off. But I noticed he was flapping his wings but not getting air born and he wasn't eating which was a major concern for me.

I knew I needed some help as to what to do so I called Steve and Sharyn as I knew Sharyn was a Hummingbird lover and could help me. And help me she did and gave me the name and phone number of a Wildlife Rehab Center. The Rehab Center gave me the name of a lady, Morgan Bane, who handles Hummingbird problems and said if we could bring him to her home in Corona she would see what see could do for him. So, we hurriedly drove to Corona knowing the bird needed immediate attention.

Once there Morgan took him and she has been treating him with pain meds and food and has been keeping us informed as to his condition. As of this writing he was doing much better she said but still not flying which could be a problem. Now we have our fingers crossed that he starts flying soon.

We get home and guess what we find, another "Rufous Bird" flying around and intimidating all the other birds and not letting them eat, just like the other Rufous bird did. Maybe they were brothers and if so, now we have the same problem!

So much for our Hummingbird story, and I know this is a Corvette Newsletter but I felt this was worth sharing. And I wonder how many others of us have Hummingbirds in our yards and have feeders for them also?

And lastly, I want to wish everyone a wonderful Easter, with family and friends as it is a Very Special Day! Hopefully April will bring some sunny weather so we can get our Vettes out for a nice drive.

It's 1993 and Corvette is celebrating its 40th anniversary. But sales are down because the body style has not changed in 10 years and people are waiting for the new style. General Motors is saying maybe we should not build the Corvette anymore. So they announced the end of Corvette. Well, General Motors got inundated with telegram articles and phone calls from all over the world. So some people at General Motors marketing thought maybe if they could get people to drive the car maybe sales would go up. So they hired a marketing company to put together a "drive and ride" for the Corvette.

I had the pleasure of going to a meeting with Dick Guldstrand of Guldstrand Engineering and Jim Perkins, General Manager of Chevrolet. Jim Perkins was the one responsible for saving the Corvette. We put on the "America Dream and Drive" all over the United States in different cities inviting people to come out and drive a Corvette. I did a lot of phone calls to different NCCC clubs all over setting up dates of when the "Dream and Drive" would be in their city for which we would need their assistance.

We held this in 1993, 1994, and 1995. And the Corvette survived! In 1995 the C5 came out and it was the most advanced Corvette ever built at that time. Nothing interchanged with the C4. Everything on the C5 was new and the sales skyrocketed. The one man responsible for saving the Corvette was Jim Perkins.

At the next General Meeting I am going to pass around a sign-up sheet and ask members to let me know if you want to take one day trips or an overnighter. I have some ideas on some runs that we can do in one day and others that would require us to stay overnight. So please let me know.

Just to let you know, Dan Flanigan's article has been approved by the National Audubon Society and is probably up for an award.




There will be no more new Camaros until the new Electric Camaros come out.


